Next year—at the conclusion of his four years in the California Legislature—he

will be termed out. He announced recently that he will seek another elected political office but he promises that next Wednesday's program will not be a political campaign speech, in compliance with the rules of the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa.


and the California Stock Exchange. He was truly fascinating so we decided to forgive the fact that he did not have much to say about baseball.


