

#### NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

Good old days: No one remembers when a cash bar became part of Santa Rosa Rotary Fellowship. **Past Presidents Bill Pederson and Chuck Bartley** swear that it was already open when they joined back in the mid-sixties. The bar was shut down in 1987...about the same time that Rotary admitted women. Probably just a coincidence.

1925 Rotary dues: The Rotary Club of Santa Rosa had 45 members by May 1925. Three and a half years after Rotary was founded in Santa Rosa, quarterly membership dues were \$12...that's \$48 a year! If the annual dues were adjusted for inflation as of 2011, the Club's annual dues would be about \$600. The Club Historian is still researching the cost of lunch and hasn't found the bookkeeping for recognitions.

Mr. Harris, meet Mr. Burbank: The day our Rotary Club was founded—90 years ago this week—72 year old Luther Burbank was made an honorary Rotarian. He passed away five years later, on April 11, 1926, not long after Rotary Founder Paul Harris took the ferry across San Francisco Bay to meet the world-famous Plant Wizard. **High Society:** From the Roaring Twenties and until the Great Depression stopped the music, several local string quartets played at the weekly Rotary meetings held in Santa Rosa's most luxurious Occidental Hotel. Our archives mentions the musical entertainment at lunch only in passing.

Past Presidents Pedersen & Stone: The founder of Pedersen's Furniture was club president in 1937-38. Twenty-seven years later William Obert Pedersen became a Rotarian and served as president of this club for Rotary Year 1965-66. J. Ralph Stone was Rotary president in 1955-56 and his son Robert Pedersen followed in his footsteps in 1983-84.

**International recognition:** In our archives is a beautiful brass & walnut plaque dated 1987-88. It reads "Rotary International acknowledges the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa as a 10,000% Club". Does anyone remember what it meant to achieve 10,000 percent?
