The first regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa was held in the Occidental Hotel, our club's 4th Street home for many years. We received our charter from Rotary's national headquarters only a few days after Thanksgiving, on December 2, 1921. It was the first Rotary Club in Sonoma County, the first of a dozen more Rotary Clubs in the county and the second oldest of the 46 active Rotary Clubs in District 5130.
