

Next Wednesday marks the second Public Safety Awards without founder Lee Abramson, who passed away in 2010 after serving as the driving force behind one of this Rotary Club's oldest ongoing local project. The awards were established 18 years ago by two veteran Rotarians of this 90- year-old club—retired business executive Abramson and the late community leader & attorney Everett Shapiro—who proposed these awards as an annual vocational service recognition of outstanding public safety officers from the police and fire departments of Santa Rosa. The first awards were made in 1994 by then Police Chief Sal Rosano and the late Fire Chief Tony Pini. Attending this year's awards ceremony

## **PROJECT AMIGO TRIP**

**Past President Will Haymaker** alerted us all that now is the time to get serious about to going down to Mexico for Project Amigo during Literacy Week— March 3 through 11, 2012. Saturday morning we depart from SFO via U.S. Airways at 9:20 am and arrive GDL (Guadalajara) at 5:30 pm. The Project Amigo van will pick us up at the airport for the pleasant, three-hour ride to the village of Cofradia (with complimentary refreshments in the van) and arrive for Happy Hour and a fantastic Mexican dinner at the Hacienda Lodging. **Program Chair Matt Everson**, who had invited Robert Revel to talk to Rotary about conflict resolution, was missing in action today. **President Marnie** stepped right in and introduced mediator/ author Robert Revel, who used Rotary's Four Way Test to emphasize the value of conflict in the interpersonal lives of all humanity. Defining conflict as a disagreement or clash between ideas, points of view, or principles, Revel strongly believes conflict between us to be healthy; nurturing cooperation, diversity, and the genesis of innovative thinking the very skills that make us uniquely homo sapiens, among all living creatures on earth.

Quoting the noted psychologist Dr. Marshall Rosenberg, Revel called the art of cooperation the "Golden Key" to human relationships, satisfying our universal needs to survive: safety, trust, autonomy of individuals, pleasure, harmony, and purpose of existence. An outstanding, thought-provoking glimpse into human nature that uses conflict to resolve the differences that make life so challenging and rewarding.
