

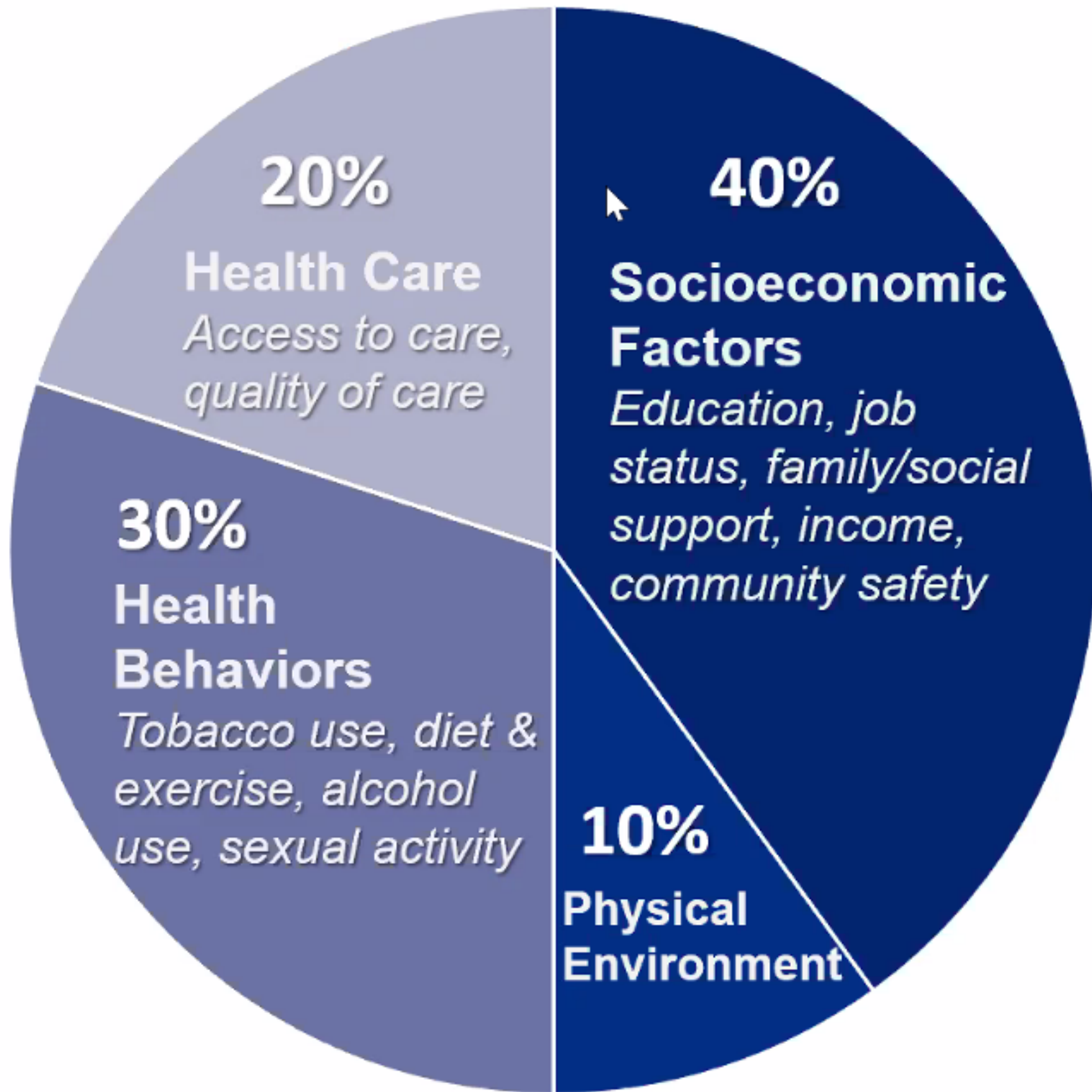
# What is Community Health Investment?

- Nonprofit hospitals must do something to benefit the community, i.e., “community benefit”
- IRS requires it to be included on tax filings, but no minimum amount defined
- Some states have specific/minimum requirements, not in California
- We have always done community benefit—it’s part of the legacy of the Sisters of St. Joseph and Providence

# Impact of Social Determinants of Health



Social determinants of health (SDOH) have tremendous effect on an individual's health regardless of age, race, or ethnicity.

## SDOH Impact

- ➔ **20%** of a person's health and well-being is related to access to care and quality of services
- ➔ The physical environment, social determinants, and behavioral factors drive **80%** of health outcomes

# Providence Community Health Investment

## Spectrum of Prevention Approach

Downstream:

Safety net services, direct patient and client services, population health strategies

Examples:

Mobile Health Clinic, Dental clinics, CARE Network and Santa Rosa Community Health Homeless Care Transitions, Project Nightingale and COTS' MIC recuperative beds, Medical Legal Partnership

# Providence Community Health Investment

## Spectrum of Prevention Approach

Midstream:

System of care assessments/analyses and interventions to increase access, organizational and system capacities, and culture change

Examples:

Petaluma Sober Circle, Permanent Supportive Housing, Regional Behavioral Health Integration Project, Health Care for the Homeless Collaborative, Behavioral Health navigation project, maternal mental health (Mothers Care, Growing Together, etc.), ACEs Aware Network of Care (Sonoma Connect)

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# Providence Community Health Investment

## Spectrum of Prevention Approach

Upstream:

Education, community engagement, community organizing, health screening/early intervention, policy advocacy, organizational culture change

Examples:

Sonoma Intersections Coalition, Sonoma County Tenants Union, Community Building Initiative, Healthy for Life, Self-Healing Communities Model, Community Health Promotion (Promotoras de Salud), Burbank Housing trauma-informed culture intervention, Providence “Housing is Health” initiative, Providence “Health Equity Investment” initiative, Sonoma County Health Action
