

- The Performing Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) was formed in 1984 to rescue and provide sanctuary for neglected, abused or retired captive wild animals
- Animals come from zoos, circuses and exotic "pet" trade, private owners
- Three sanctuaries in California, including the 2,300-acre natural habitat ARK 2000 sanctuary
- Expansive environments
- Rehabilitate animals (restore their health)
- Animals have more choices
- True sanctuary
- Advocacy essential
- Educate the public







Asian and African Elephants

- Active in mind and body
- Huge range sizes (92-700 sq. miles)
- ▶ Live in matriarch-led families
- Communicate through sight, sound, smell, and seismically
- Highly intelligent
 - ▶ Make and use tools
 - Mourn dead relatives
 - Understand what others are feeling (empathy)
- Asian and African are endangered species





Tigers


- Largest cat species in the world
- ▶ Found in Asia
- Habitats
 - ► Evergreen or tropical forests
 - Mangrove swamps and grasslands
- Range territories: from 6 square miles to over
 500 square miles (travel 4-12 miles a day)
- ▶ Highly endangered: about 3,900 in the wild








PAWS ARK 2000 Sanctuary

Black Bears

- ▶ Intelligent, strong and active omnivores
- Use tools
- ► About 600,000 in North America
- ► Habitat: Forested areas
- ► Home range: As big as 50 square miles
- Important for the environment
















Long-term care

Mara 31 years at PAWS






Zeppo and Chico 25 years at PAWS

Colton Tigers

- 2004 Largest big cat rescue in US history at that time
- 39 tigers rescued
- ▶ 90 dead tigers, including 58 cubs in a freezer found at owner's residence
- Tigers were neglected, sick, injured, starving
- Alka, last of the tigers, passed away in 2020
- Cost of care over 16 years: more than \$3.75 million
