TOP 10 THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT THE YMCA



WE'VE BEEN AROUND FOR A WHILE



The first YMCA was founded in 1844 in London, England by twenty-two-year-old George Williams. He and 11 friends organized the first YMCA as a refuge of Bible study and prayer for young men seeking escape from the hazards of life on the streets.

In December, 1851, retired Boston sea captain Thomas Valentine Sullivan led the formation of the first YMCA in the United States as a "home away from home" for sailors and merchants.





The Sonoma County Family YMCA was founded in 1954. Initial programs included Indian Guides (now known as Adventure Guides) and summer camps to serve families.



WE'RE PRETTY INNOVATIVE

Over the past 175 years, the YMCA movement has given birth to many innovations that we take for granted today. These include:

Sports & Excercise

- 1891 James Naismith invents basketball while working as a YMCA physical fitness director.
- 1895 Looking for a sport less physical than basketball for businessmen, William Morgan invented volleyball at the Holyoke, MA YMCA.
- 1895 Professional football began at Y. The Latrobe, PA YMCA football team paid John Brailer \$10 plus expenses to replace its injured quarterback.
- 1910 Father's Day was first celebrated at the Spokane, WA YMCA.
- 1926 The name "Softball" was given by a representative from the Denver YMCA.
- 1950 Raquetball is invented by a YMCA volunteer at the Greenwich YMCA (Conn.).
- 1972 Judy Missett brought Jazzercize to the La Jolla
- YMCA in San Diego.





YOU'VE PROBABLY EXPERIENCED A PROGRAM THAT STARTED AT THEY

 1885 – The first YMCA swimming pool was built at the Brooklyn Central YMCA (N.Y.).

- 1907 George Corsan of the Detroit YMCA develops the concept of group swim lessons.
 Since then, tens of millions of people have learned to swim at the Y.
- 1881 the term "bodybuilding" was coined by Robert Roberts of the Boston YMCA. He also developed the exercise classes that led to today's fitness workouts.
- 1856 the nation's first-known English as a Second Language Class (ESL) was held for German immigrants at the Cincinnati YMCA.
- 1893 the Boston YMCA begins large-scale evening classes in liberal arts and vocational courses.

Our Vision

We're a place for everybody.

Last year, we gave out over \$210,000 in Financial Assistance to families, seniors and adults for child care, swim lessons, youth sports, day camp, and membership opportunities.



THE Y IS THE LARGEST CHILDCARE PROVIDER IN SONOMA COUNTY

Every school day, we have over 1,300 children in our afterschool and licensed childcare programs.

Every summer we serve over 3,000 day-campers in a variety of camps that range from arts to science to sports.





The Sonoma County Family YMCA is an inclusive organization.

As part of our strategic plan, our goal is serve the entire community, and we are working hard to ensure our staff reflect the community as well.

- Our board of directors reflects the community with 40% representing communities of color and 31% representing the Latino community.
- 41% of our staff, including 29% who identify as Latino, are people of color.
- 1 in 5 Employees identify as LGBTQ+

Drowning is the 3rd leading cause of accidental deaths of children in the United States. That number is even larger for children of color.

- 29 Collaborations (Kaiser, St. Joseph's Health, CASA, Vamos a Nadar, Luther Burbank Housing, Sonoma County Schools, Sonoma County Regional Parks, etc.)
- We gave over \$210,000 in Financial Assistance to almost 500 youth for childcare, camp, sports and swim lessons this past year.
- We employ 270-300 people every day, making us one of the larger employers in Sonoma County.
