D-Day Anniversary 2023 by the Numbers

Nearly 160,000 Allied troops, 73,000 from the U.S. landed in Normandy on June 6, 1944

2024 marks the 80th Anniversary of D-Day

Total of 47 WWII veterans on program this year

Average age is 100. Youngest is 97 and oldest is 104

10 days of travel, June 3 - June 12, 2024

What do volunteers do?

Every veteran has a caregiver who accompanies them every step

Medical staff - physicians, RNs, paramedics

Admin managing logistics and the day to day issues


Media team - providing photography and video for each veteran and media

The Itinerary


- June 2 Arrival in Atlanta and kick off ceremony

- June 10 School visit and Farewell dinner






