

What is GOSC Telemedicine?

GOSC is a US-based 501(c)(3) humanitarian, all-volunteer nonprofit formed in 2013. They work through Rotary club sponsored telemedicine projects to reach the underserved with improved access to healthcare using the Internet. With the help of Medical Directors Dr. Gregory Pecchia he provide accredited continuing medical education sessions through grand rounds and promote team-based care linking doctors over the Internet.

Global OffSite Care is a catalyst for increasing access to specialized healthcare for all and providing technology platforms to doctors and clinics around the world through Rotary Club sponsored telemedicine projects.

Project Selection

Is the project relevant to the needs of the community? Do a community assessment to identify the community's specific needs and challenges. Consider how the local community can partner with your club to meet the needs the community has prioritized.

Is the project sustainable? Design projects that can be sustained over time, ensuring long-term impact.

Can the project be completed with the resources available? Assess the resources available to ensure the project's feasibility.

Will the project have a positive impact on the lives of the people it serves? Establish clear project objectives and evaluation metrics to assess the project's effectiveness.

Is the project aligned with one of Rotary's areas of focus? Ensure the project directly addresses one of Rotary's seven areas of focus if you'll be applying for a global grant to support the effort.


